NOW - JANUARY 18 Profound Prints: Art by Exceptional Women

HILLIARD ART MUSEUM

The exhibition showcases women printmakers' bold and varied works from the 1970s to now. This collection celebrates the creativity and diverse approaches of these artists, who have each developed their unique artistic vocabularies, enriching the art world with their distinct perspectives.

NOW - FEBRUARY 22 From Inspiration to Evolution: The Journey to French Modern Art HILLIARD ART MUSEUM

This exhibition, designed to run in tandem with Rodin Toward Modernity, offers a deep dive into the vibrant artistic landscape of 19th and early 20th-century France. It celebrates the work of Rodin's contemporaries by exploring the intricate web of influences and inspirations that contributed to the birth and evolution of modern French art.

NOW - JANUARY 11 George Loli: Theatrics of Space ACADIANA CENTER FOR THE ARTS

Theatrics of Space is a posthumous celebration of the artwork and legacy of George Loli, a longtime professor of art at the University of Louisiana at Lafayette. This exhibition features artwork from across Loli's lifetime and the work of several students and colleagues he influenced throughout his career. The exhibition charts the evolution of Lafayette from a historical and artistic context and celebrates the dynamism of the local community at the intersection of education and art.

NOW - APRIL 30 Rodin: Toward Modernity HILLIARD ART MUSEUM

The exhibit includes 40 bronze sculptures by Auguste Rodin (1840-1917), regarded during his lifetime as the greatest sculptor since Michelangelo and selected from the collections of the Iris and B. Gerald Cantor Foundation, the North Carolina Museum of Art, and Cincinnati Art Museum, the exhibition will include many of the French sculptor's most well-known works.







A relatively recent invention, the bellows-driven, vibrating reed squeezebox known as the accordion, was first manufactured in Germany and later in Russia in the 1820s. It is unknown who brought the first accordion to South Louisiana or which French Creole or Acadian first played the instrument, but daguerreotypes from mid-century — decades before German immigrants settled Roberts Cove in 1881 — show accordions in use in the south and central portions of the state.

Musicologists believe that black Creole musicians were likely the first to incorporate the accordion into their repertoire. Acceptance by white Cajun musicians came decades later, likely because the first imported accordions played in the keys of A and F, making them harmoniously incompatible with the fiddle-led ensembles of the day. By the 1920s, a new generation of accordions tuned to the keys of C and D made the instrument suitable for pairing with stringed instruments. These German-made, single-row, diatonic button squeezeboxes (or piano accordions) — the Monarch, Sterling, Eagle, and Hohner brands were especially popular — were decimated by German Jewish immigrant merchants who set up stores in many Acadiana towns.



On April 27, 1928, Joseph Falcon and his future wife, Cléoma Breaux, recorded the first Cajun music sides for Columbia Records in New Orleans. Those two songs, "Lafayette" and "The Waltz That Carried Me To My Grave," feature Falcon playing a button accordion beside Breaux's guitar. One year later, on December 9, 1929, Creole accordionist Amédé Ardoin recorded six songs alongside a Cajun fiddler named Dennis McGee, a rare integrated collaboration for the period.

Born in Evangeline Parish, near Basile, Ardoin would become arguably the most influential early Creole accordionist of all time (his friend Adam Fontenot was another popular accordionist from the era). Over the next half-century, his cousin Alphonse "Bois Sec" Ardoin popularized Creole accordion music, often called "La La," in concert performances, recordings, and documentary films.

Bois Sec's Cajun contemporary and counterpart was Nathan Abshire. Born in Gueydan, Abshire reintroduced the accordion to Cajun music in the 1940s after German manufacturers stopped exporting the instrument before and during World War II. Musicians — including Sidney Brown, Larry Miller, and Marc Savoy — started repairing and crafting accordions of their own design. These producers, alongside Abshire and other early practitioners like Iry LeJeune and Hadley Fontenot, led a Cajun music renaissance that influenced the work of accordionists Jo-El Sonnier, Wayne Toups, Lee Benoit, and Andre Michot, among many others.

The rise of the fast-tempo syncopations of Zydeco's chromatic button accordions in the 1950s was mainly due to the "King of Zydeco," Clifton Chenier. An Opelousas native, Chenier's recording and performing career transformed him into a bonafide roots music superstar in the 1960s.










The prairie parishes west of Opelousas remain a hotbed for raising Zydeco accordionists. Today, three of Bois Sec's grandchildren — Dexter, Sean, and Chris — lead their own accordion-driven Zydeco bands. An honor roll of Zydeco accordionists, past and present, must also include Boozoo Chavis, Buckwheat Zydeco, Beau Jocque, John Delafose, his son Geno Delafose, Chubby Carrier, and Horace Trahan.

Cajun music is a central component and marker of Cajun identity and culture in southwestern Louisiana. Largely accordion and fiddle-based and primarily sung in vernacular French, Cajun music has foundations in Indigenous American, African, German, Irish, Anglo-American, and Francophone folk traditions. Both rooted in the past and dynamically progressive, Cajun music is just as popular at home as it is worldwide.

On April 27, 1928, the husband-and-wife team of Joseph Falcon, on accordion and vocals, and Cléoma Breaux Falcon, on guitar, recorded the first Cajun music sides in history for Columbia Phonograph Company: "The Waltz That Carried Me to My Grave" and "Lafayette." The record's success led to more opportunities for the Falcons and other musicians.



Though the early Cajun fiddlers are best remembered today — names like Dennis McGee and Sady Courville — an acoustic accordion sound defined the classic period of the 1930s and early 1940s.

The accordion would eventually be overshadowed by the popular string bands of the prewar era, when bandleaders like Harry Choates, the "Fiddle King of Cajun Swing," and Leo Soileau traded influences with the up-tempo string bands of Western swing. Choates' "Jole Blon" became one of the biggest all-time Cajun hits, reaching number four on the Billboard Country charts in 1946.



After World War II, the accordion returned to center stage with the virtuosic but short-lived career of Iry LeJeune, whose "Love Bridge Waltz" and "Evangeline Special," recorded in 1946, were local sensations.

Around this same time, the culture of Cajun dancing transformed. Family-centric house dances, commonly called *fais do-dos*, from the Cajun French 'go to sleep,' gradually faded away, replaced by a modern dancehall that served alcohol (and likely a gambling room in the back). Traditional, popular European dances for one or many couples, like the quadrille, mazurka, and contra dance, were subsumed by the two-step, jitterbug, and waltz, which remain the standard Cajun dance steps today.



By the 1960s, Cajun musicians like fiddler Dewey Balfa toured the global folk festival circuit. Meanwhile, local labels, notably Swallow Records and abroad, brought the music to the masses. New restaurant dancehalls and festivals proliferated in Louisiana, riding the wave of a homegrown cultural Cajun Renaissance. Lafayette's Festivals Acadiens, the merging of two previous annual events, premiered in 1977 before changing its name to Festivals Acadiens et Créoles in 2008. Today, it is the world's largest Cajun and Creole music and heritage festival.



Inspired by the linguistic, culinary, and musical Cajun revival of the 1970s, a new wave of artists like Zachary Richard, Wayne Toups, BeauSoleil avec Michael Doucet, and Steve Riley and the Mamou Playboys toured the globe, performing traditional and original Louisiana music.

The 21st century brought attention to the band as a unit and identity in Cajun music. Many members of contemporary bands like the Pine Leaf Boys, Lost Bayou Ramblers, Feufollet, the Red Stick Ramblers, T'Monde, and the Revelers can trace their Cajun music lineages back one or more generations.


